


AARON BROCK

Aaron Brock is gaining a reputation as an artist who “plays with superior musical depth and technical knowledge” (Colony Reporter, Mexico) while delivering his audiences “a spellbinding evening of music” (Sun Tribune, Canada). Aaron Brock has won numerous prizes and awards including first place at the Rantoucci Guitar Competition and the Appalachian Guitarfest Competition as well as top prizes at the Barnett Foundation Guitar Competition, the Schadt String International Concerto Competition and the American String Teachers Association.

Currently, Aaron is on the guitar faculty at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. Upon receiving his Doctorate of Musical Arts from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with Nicholas Goluses, Brock was chosen to be the first ever recipient of Eastman’s ‘Andrés Segovia Award’. The award is granted for showing a ‘deep commitment to expanding the technical and musical boundaries of the guitar repertoire’.
