

Bonner Cabot Is Married Here To David Elwell, an Architect

Miss Margaret Bonner Cabot, daughter of George Bonner Cabot of Salisbury, Conn., formerly of New York, Boston and Muray Bay, Quebec, and the late Mrs. Cabot, was married yesterday to David Henry Elwell, who is with the architectural firm of Phillip Johnson and John Burgee. Mr. Elwell is the son of Richard Derby Elwell of Jericho, L.I., and Mrs. Ethel Joseph Elwell of Cedarhurst, L.I.

The afternoon ceremony in the chapel of St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church here was performed by the Rev. Dr. Terence J. Finlay, the rector. A reception followed at the River Club.

The bride, who is a sculptor, prefers to be known by

her middle name rather than by her first. Bonner is the maiden name of her paternal grandmother, the late Mrs. Francis H. Cabot. Mrs. Elwell attended the Garrison Forest School and made her debut in Boston. She is a great-grandniece of the late Senator Henry Cabot Lodge of Massachusetts.

Her husband, a graduate of Phillips Academy, Andover and Yale University, served as a lieutenant in the Navy. He received a bachelor's degree from Jesus College, Cambridge University, and a master's degree from the School of Architecture at Princeton University. His father is a consulting engineer.
