

The Palos Hills Forest Preserves contain outstanding geologic features of the Valparaiso glacial moraine and the limestone bedrock that underlies the Chicago/NW Indiana Region. Camp Sagawau Environmental Center has a fine museum, hiking trails, abandoned limestone quarry, and the only natural stream-cut rock canyon in Cook County. 
◆Veteran's Benefits
